

Scissor Lift

Used Scissor Lift Bellevue - Scissor lifts are industrial machines that rely on a configuration of crisscrossed linked steel arms. This equipment is utilized to create an “X” patterned support in order to accomplish vertical lifting. There is a rectangular platform that is attached to the top of the scissor lift. There are secure support railings along the platform edge for extra safety and to keep the operator safe. The scissor lift has a low profile to maintain stability on hard, compact surfaces like concrete. Scissor lifts can use an electric motor or a combustion engine to transport and lift the machine. Since the scissor lift functions on a vertical plane, if it needs to be repositioned horizontally, the operator will have to move it into place. Rough terrain and regular lift models rely on the same lifting technology to maneuver the lifting components. Rough terrain scissor lifts are adapted for travelling on uneven locations. These machines rely on large all-terrain tires to allow rough terrain scissor lifts to traverse difficult locations while offering higher ground clearance. Certain models offer 4WD making them able to traverse through dirty areas. The higher center of gravity works in conjunction with lower lifting heights. These machines can be intimidating if you have never been on one or operated one previously. Images of swaying in the wind and being precariously balanced may come to mind. Feel secure knowing you will not feel the lift even moving and you will be in a stable position. Rigorous safety testing has to be completed prior to selling these machines. It is natural to feel unsure of these units until you can familiarize yourself with them. It is essential to maintain safety precautions all of the time. Understanding what you will be using your scissor lift for will help ensure you have the right type of model. The scissor lift model you will need will largely depend on the types of jobs you will need to do. Key factors to consider include how high you will need to reach and the types of loads you will be moving. There are specific models available to take you to extreme heights. Smaller models are commonly used for interior applications including warehouses and freight or factory settings. If you do not need the highest capacity model, there is no need to choose the largest unit available. Electric scissor lifts have optional platforms and railings to offer maximum safety features. These machines are designed to be reliable and safe. If these machines did not follow strict safety rules and particular inspections, they would not be for sale across the globe. These machines help us facilitate tasks that would otherwise not be possible. These machines are situated in place before elevating vertically. Before the lift is engaged, the operator will properly position the unit. Many safety features have been incorporated into these units. Safety is accomplished by following operational guidelines. The scissor lift’s safety basket creates a secure work area compared to trying to accomplish similar tasks from a ladder or scaffolding. Most scissor lifts utilize internally mounted batteries located inside the base of the machine to provide power. Electric scissor lifts need to be charged regularly; especially after prolonged work shifts. Numerous operators charge their units throughout the day or replace batteries every 12 hours. To facilitate scissor lift charging, the operator can park the machine close to an electrical outlet in a well-ventilated place. The emergency shut-off switch is engaged upon parking to prevent other operators from driving off while plugged in. The emergency shut-off switch is the big red button located in the basket or the lift close to the control box or the charger. Oftentimes, the battery charger is found on the right side of the lift on the base of the machine. Older scissor lifts may have a battery charger found on the back of the unit. The scissor lift charger is plugged into the AC extension cord into a well-ventilated location. Next, the extension cord plugs into an electrical outlet. The electrical cord length on the battery charger has to be short for safety reasons to prevent the unit from running over it. There is a high possibility of danger if the extension cord dropped out of the battery charger while the machine is in operation. Once the scissor lift is plugged in, all of the lights on the charger should ideally become illuminated. The batteries will automatically begin charging once plugged in. The battery lights will switch to green once complete charging has occurred and the charger will shut off. Models that are older and rely on a meter will show zero volts after they are charged fully and then the charger will also turn off automatically.

After the batteries are completely charged the scissor lift can complete another shift. Many places employ their scissor lift for 24 hours a day by having additional batteries continually charging.
